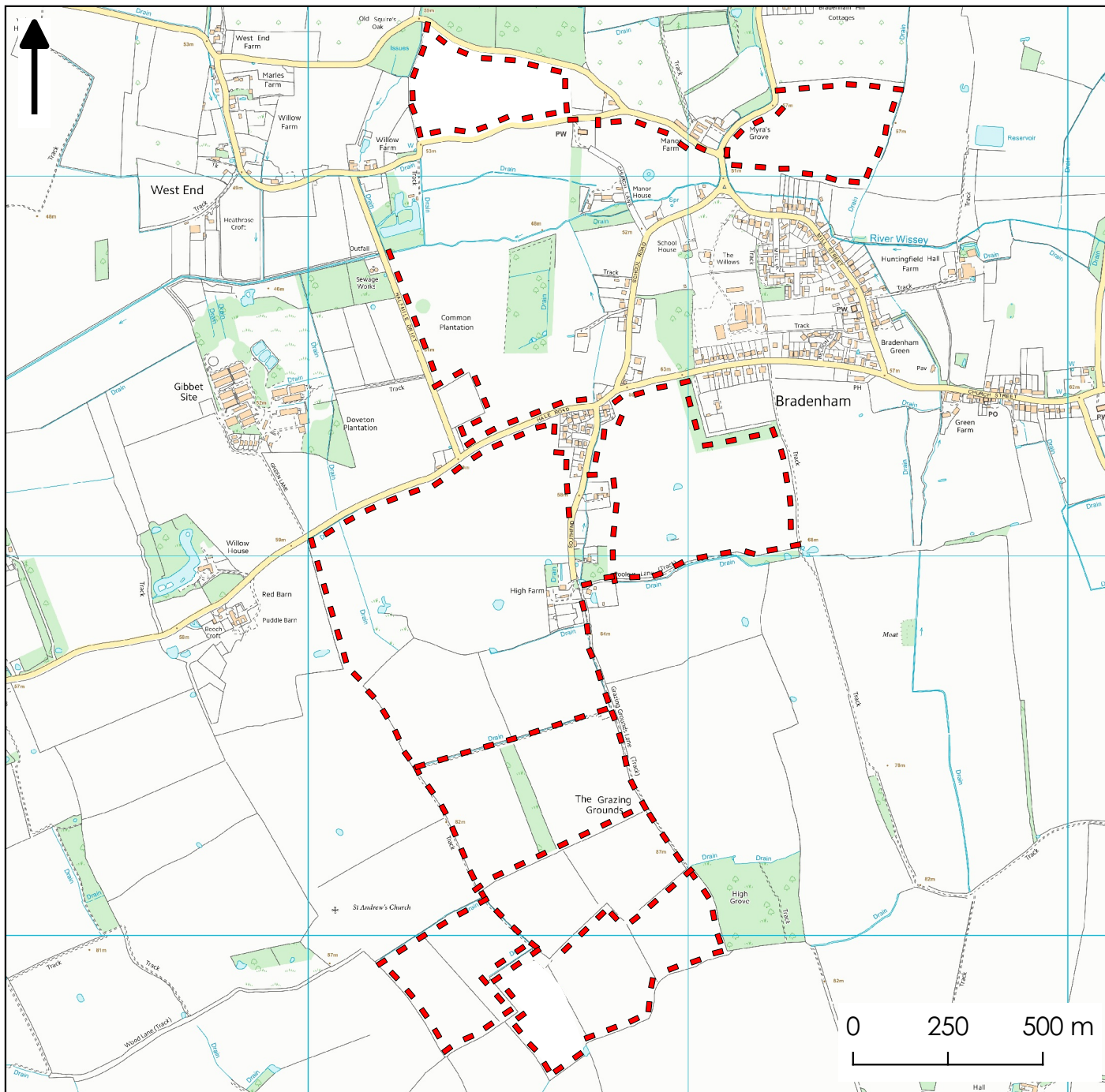


PERMISSIVE ACCESS

You are welcome to use the permissive footpaths shown on the map below which have been provided by Bradenham Hall Farms through an agreement with Bradenham Parish Council. The footpaths follow grass or hard tracks and grass margins established as wildlife habitat. There are many species-rich hedgerows on the estate and plots of seed mixture are being grown to benefit farmland birds such as English partridge, linnets and tree sparrow. Nectar-flower plots have also been established to provide a food source for pollinators. Please stick to mown margins to avoid disturbing wildlife and keep dogs on a lead. Please take any dog mess home with you, or flick it off the path into the base of a hedge.



This access has been provided under agreement between Bradenham Hall Farms and Bradenham Parish Council. It is permissive access and no new rights of way are being created. Existing rights of way are not affected. Please follow the Countryside Code and observe any other requirements shown above. Do not disturb wildlife, livestock or other visitors and in particular keep dogs on a lead. This is working farmland so please take care, especially around crops which may have received chemical inputs; people using this site do so at their own risk. Access ends on 31st October 2028.
