Norfolk Police have a new initiative which we are calling #ParkWalkTalk which will see our officers driving out to the parishes and towns, parking up and walking around the local community, taking advantage to stop and chat with local residents and business owners. If you see our officers out on foot beat, do give them a wave, or even better, walk with them and have a chat!

### WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR AREA?

Your local Beat Managers, PC Ed and PC Austin have continued to focus their patrols around the current Safer Neighbourhood Action Panel priorities and their proactivity has produced some very good results. Working in partnership with the Roads Policing and Camera Safety Team their has been speed enforcement, not just on the priority areas of Norwich and Dereham Road Watton but also in other villages. The Beat Managers have also used their powers under Section 59 of the Police Reform act it tackling vehicle ASB with one driver being issued with a Section 59 warning. The Beat Managers have also undertaken a number of virtual school visits giving talks on Road Safety, Internet use and Domestic Abuse and Consent—all of which was met with enthusiasm from our younger members of the community. Don't forget, if you see the Beat Managers out on their regular foot patrols do stop and say hello or give them a wave!

### CRIME UPDATES (MAY 2021)

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	4	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	3	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary business and community	0	A person commits theft in a building or structure that is not lived in.
Burglary residential	2	Entry and theft in a building or a structure that is lived in.
Criminal Damage	3	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	5	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexual-
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	2	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	6	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of
Robbery	1	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	2	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
